This intensive, 4 day, 40-hour course will provide the student with the knowledge and ability to effectively use and instruct others in the handling of patrol rifles such as the M-16/AR-15 family. It is specifically structured for law enforcement personnel who are assigned (or will be assigned) responsibility for instructing and maintaining a Department's patrol rifle program as well as incorporating the patrol rifle into active shooter/rapid deployment training and response to actual ongoing incidents. Students will be required to demonstrate both their proficiency with the rifle and as an instructor during class presentations, and successfully pass a written test. A comprehensive manual will be provided to each student.

LEAD INSTRUCTOR: R. K. Miller, Huntington Beach, Police Department, (ret.). 30+ years law enforcement experience and over 17 years of tactical assignments including SWAT Team Leader. Certified as a firearms instructor by H&K, Singleton International, the NRA and the FBI. Lt. Miller has a wide range of experience in providing firearms and tactical training.

Class size is limited. Reservations will be accepted on a first come first served basis.

CANCELLATION POLICY: The NTC cancellation policy requires at least two (2) weeks notice prior to the start of the class for cancellation of reservations. Agencies cancelling previously made reservations with less than two weeks notice will be charged an appropriate fee. "No-shows" will result in the agency

being billed the full tuition if no replacement student is enrolled by the agency making the reservation.

REQUIRED EQUIPMENT: Patrol Rifle, sling, flashlight & at least 3 magazines. Normal duty/tactical gear including pistol, ballistic vest, elbow & knee pads, shooting mat, 1000 rounds of applicable ammunition and 50 rounds pistol ammunition. Wrap around style clear eye protection, hearing protection, BDU type clothing and inclement weather gear. (The training will take place regardless of weather). A small notebook for taking notes is also required.

COURSE EXPECTATIONS: This is an instructor level course. Students should be capable of basic operator skills with their assigned rifles **prior** to the start of class. This class is both mentally and physically demanding with each training day lasting 10 hours. In order to complete the course, it will be necessary for each student to demonstrate safe and proficient weapons handling, successfully pass a written test and a qualification course of fire and participate in a presentation as a student/instructor. Students should be prepared for the challenges of this course. **Class will start promptly at 0730 on the first day.**
